The recipient of this award is recognized for their professionalism and their long-term contributions to the aquatic resources of Missouri.

The A. Stephen Weithman, Jr. Leadership Award

This award was created to honor A. Stephen Weithman, Jr. for his long-term and outstanding leadership to the Missouri Chapter and Missouri's aquatic resources. The recipient of this award is recognized for their leadership qualities which continue the leadership standards Steve established.

The Lee Redmond Citizen's Award

This award is given to persons not directly employed in the aquatic field who make a substantial contribution to Missouri's aquatic resource.

Letter of Recognition

A letter of recognition is given to an aquatics professional, a citizen, or a group to acknowledge one-time or short-term contributions that may not be covered by the other awards.
